An attractive show cave located in Khao Chom Phon in a public park at the west end of Chom Bueng. The cave in an arboretum and there is a 10 baht entrance fee (5 baht for children).

A flight of steps leads to the entrance and another flight down inside so that the cave is more or less level with the plain outside. The impressive, well decorated 20 m wide and 8-10 m high main passage appears to be a relict of a major stream and contains evidence of occasional standing water. At the southern end a large daylight hole opens into a 25 m diameter chamber dominated by an 8 m reclining Buddha. The cave is a bat roost.

The cave has little prospect of extension and is in a small limestone hill.

In the year 1895 H.M. King Chulalongkorn and H.M. Queen Sri Bajarindra made a royal visit there and they liked the beauty of this cave very much thus giving a new name, Tham Chom Pon or Field Marshal Cave. On the 23 March 1978 H. Kusch and I. Staber visited the cave and caught the holotype of *Dichillus kuschstabei* Kaszab, 1980.

Thirty steps lead up to the phreatic half-tube entrance. This soon opens into a daylit chamber with Buddha statue. From here there is about 50 m of passage leading to a chamber lit by a skylight with another Buddha statue. The cave is reported to continue to a second entrance, but this passage is dangerous as it is home to cobras. Another side passage was also reported to be dangerous.

Located at the southern end of the Khao Ngu range, 7 km west of Ratchaburi. Tham Fa Tho is near the top of the hill.

This is the smallest of the Khao Ngu caves. The cave is a corridor 3 to 4 m high, about 3 m wide and the main part is 12 m long. There is an 8.2 m long reclining Buddha carved in situ on the left side as one enters the cave. This dates to the Dvaravati period and the Buddha was covered with stucco. Only fragments of the halo remain today, along with parts of the Sala tree. There is also a bas-relief of three worshippers, 2.6 m, 2.3 m and 1.5 m high, carved at the same level as the Buddha's head, on the right side of the entrance. The cave was closed by a wall decorated with ceramics during the late Ayutthaya-early Bangkok period and the worshippers appeared when the wall was removed in 1975.

Some attempt is being made to preserve this cave in the face of extensive quarrying along the range which has already reached within 30-40 m, but the interior is covered with limestone dust.

The cave was explored and surveyed by Claude Chabert and Claude Mouret on 27 December 1992.

This cave has been the subject of extensive investment by the Tourist Authority of Thailand with development plans submitted by Australian speleologists. On the surface there is parking, picnic areas, stalls and an office.

The cave is electrically lit and is basically one very wide cavern divided into profusely decorated chambers by curtains and dense clusters of small stalactites. The last chamber is particularly impressive.

Conditions in the cave are discomfoting due to the presence of carbon dioxide, causing resolution of calcite decoration in places, and although it was reported that the Tourist Authority was planning to install a ducted system for circulating fresher air, Hamilton-Smith (1996) reports that the development is a disaster for the cave with the electrical system not being maintained, rubbish throughout the cave, thousands of speleothems broken off as souvenirs and the ventilation system not installed.

The cave was visited on 26 July 1981 by Fred Stone, P. Round and B. Dobias when the type specimen of *Psilodermes howarthi* Deeleman-Reinhold, 1995 plus specimens of *Uthina ratchaburi* Huber, 2011 and *Pholcus sudhami* Huber, 2011 were collected. Huber (2011) has the date for this trip as 26 August 1981, but Stone was collecting in caves in Kanchanaburi on 22 July and was in Chiang Mai on the 16 August, so the July date seems most likely.

P.R. and C.L. Deeleman visited the cave on 10 March 1986 and the type specimen of *Uthina ratchaburi* Huber, 2011 was collected along with *Psilodermes howarthi* Deeleman-Reinhold, 1995. They visited the cave again on 20 March 1986 and caught further specimens of these two species.

Fred Stone returned to the cave again on 14 August 1986 when the type specimens of *Troglopedetes convergens* Dehaveng & Gers, 1993 were collected.

The cave has three main entrances, one subhorizontal entrance at the foot of the hill and two aven entrances. The gated entrance opens into a chamber with a grill over a skylight. There are hundreds of cockroaches and an hot and foul breeze blows through the cave. A small passage leads up to the main chamber which is filled with boulders, In teh roof of this chamber is a fine 15 m shaft. Beyond the floor and walls are completely covered with a layer of up to several centimetres of guano, the ammonia smell is unbearable and there is a constant rain of excrement, as one disturbs a small part of the 2 million bats estimated to live in the cave! At the northern end of the chamber, a climb up with a 5 m wooded ladder leads to a small chamber which contained a very high concentration of bats. The passage was not explored because of collisions with the bats. The west gallery runs into a where a diffuse light comes from a beautiful 30 m aven to the surface.

The cave was explored and surveyed by Claude Mouret, Violaine Caron and Philippe Jarlan on 18 August 1994. Local villagers collect bat guano from this cave once a week under the guidance of monks from the local monastery.
